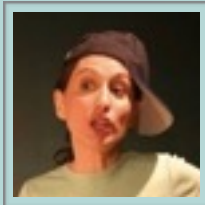


# Decoding the Tablecloth

This award-winning and critically-acclaimed, autobiographical show explores the transmission of trauma over five generations. Her family displaced from Poland to Argentina and finally to Brooklyn, Ms. Kohen finds herself growing up Jewish and Latina in New York. 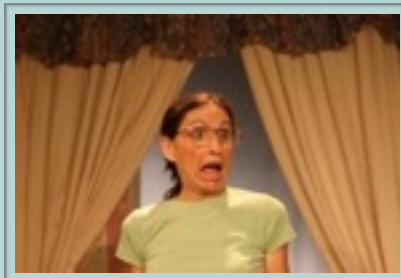
